

BEARDSLEY STUDENT NUTRITION INFORMATION

We are pleased to inform you that Beardsley School District will continue to implement a new option available to schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs called the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for the 2020-2021 School Year.

What does this mean for you and your children attending any school in the Beardsley School District?

Great news for you and your students!

All enrolled students are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at **no charge** to your household each day of the 2020-2021 school year. No further action is required of you. Your child will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit an application.

Any student in an afterschool program will be served a snack and/or a supper at no cost to the student.

Due to the CEP program, all ala-carte items will be available for purchase with cash only.

BORROW POLICY: All students eat breakfast and lunch at **no charge** due to CEP.

PAYMENT FOR MEALS: No payment for meals is required for school year 2020-2021

FREE/REDUCED APPLICATIONS: No meal applications are required due to CEP.

SPECIAL MEAL ACCOMODATIONS:

BSD will make substitutions to meals for children with a disability that restricts their diet only when supported by a written medical statement from a "state licensed healthcare professional". CDE only permits the following state licensed healthcare professionals to complete and sign a written medical statement for a disability: licensed physicians, physician assistants, or nurse practitioners.

The Student Nutrition Department does not make meal accommodations based on personal preferences or religious convictions. Our policy and special meal request forms are available at any school office or cafeteria and at **Beardsleyschool.org**.
